What you will need

- Lots of pictures of Timmy,
printed from the Hide and Sheep
sticker sheet

For Activity 1

- 1 Objects of different colours,
sizes and shapes
- 2 Containers the children can use
to collect the objects
- 3 Timmy masks for the children
to wear (optional)

For Activity 2

- 1 Copies of a recording sheet for parents,
printed from the sheet provided



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Activity 1: Found you, Timmy!

1 Using the sticker sheet, print lots of pictures of Timmy onto stickers. Stick them on objects around the nursery and outdoor area that are different colours, sizes and shapes (e.g. bricks, beakers, balls, toys). The children will need to collect the objects, so don't choose anything that's too big!

2 To get the children excited about their Timmy hunt, why not use the template for a Timmy mask (**see page 5 of this PDF**) and have a mask-making session? The children could then wear their masks while they take part in the Hide and Sheep activities.

3 Explain to the children that lots of pictures of Timmy are hidden around the nursery. Can they find them? Give each child a container and ask them to try to collect as many 'Timmy objects' as they can in a set time.

4 Once the time is up, help each child to count how many objects they have found. Who has collected the most/least? Ask the children questions about their objects, for example:

- What shape is it?
- What does it feel like?
- What colour is it?
- Where did you find it?

Can the children sort their objects into groups of the same colour or shape?

Activity 2: Where's Timmy?

1 To give parents a chance to join in the fun, print 14 Timmy stickers (from the sticker sheet) and place them around your nursery – inside and out, high and low, obvious and hidden.

2 Give each parent a copy of the recording sheet and ask them to work with their child to find as many of Timmy's hiding places as they can in 15 minutes. Encourage them to use positional words such as 'next to', 'behind', 'in front of' and 'between' to describe Timmy's hiding places.

Top Tip

Instead of pictures of Timmy, why not use photos of the children and practitioners in your nursery? For very young children, a practitioner could hide.



You could share the Jinnat's Story poster in your Nursery Fundraising Activity Pack with your little ones to help them understand why they are fundraising.

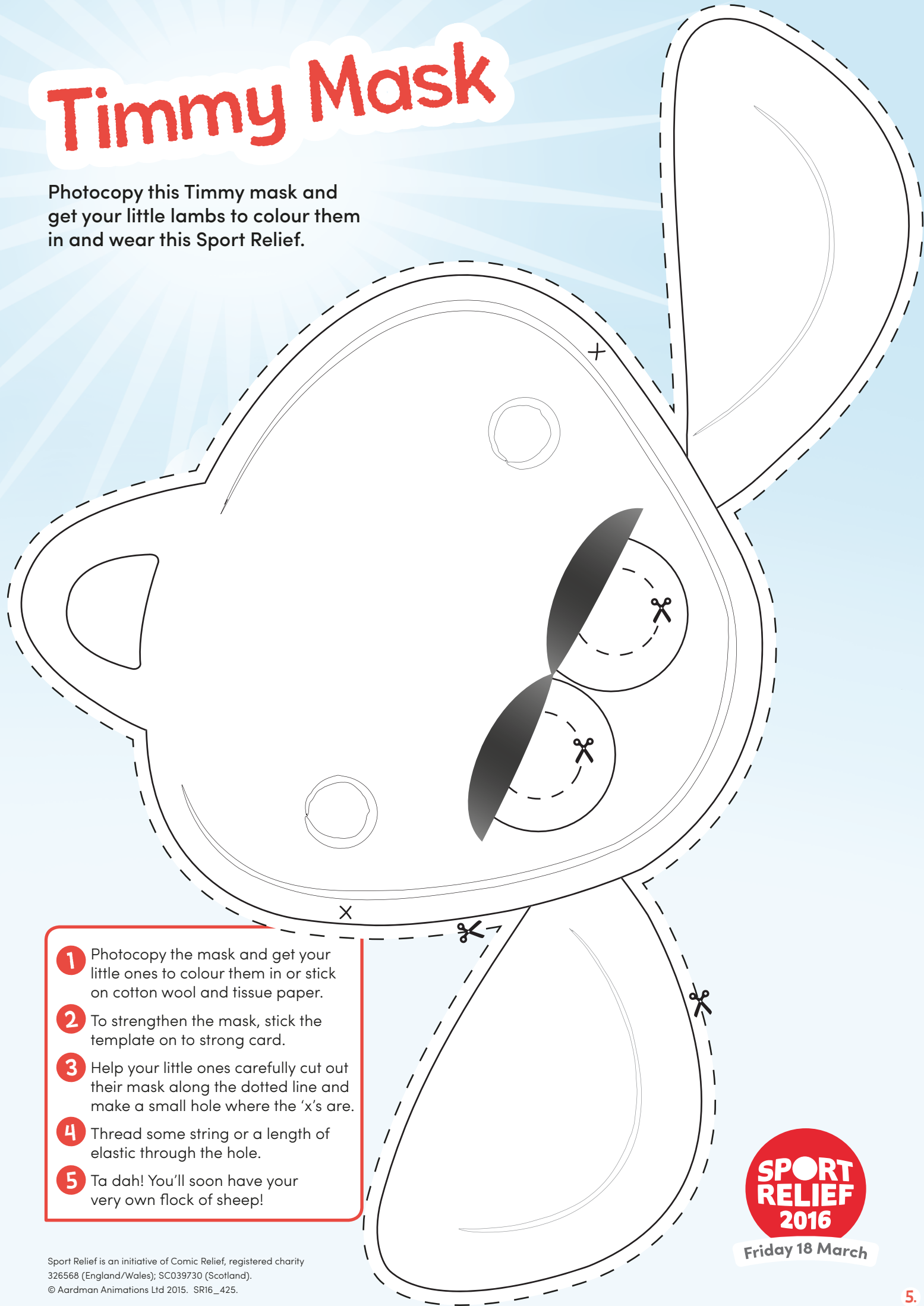

Timmy Mask

Photocopy this Timmy mask and get your little lambs to colour them in and wear this Sport Relief.



- 1 Photocopy the mask and get your little ones to colour them in or stick on cotton wool and tissue paper.
- 2 To strengthen the mask, stick the template on to strong card.
- 3 Help your little ones carefully cut out their mask along the dotted line and make a small hole where the 'x's are.
- 4 Thread some string or a length of elastic through the hole.
- 5 Ta dah! You'll soon have your very own flock of sheep!
